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PREFACE

Dear theatre programmer,

We're proud to announce that as of 2025, we will be part of the Dutch Basic Infrastructure for the Arts (BIS), and we would like to present to you our programme for season 2025-2026. We take you and your young audience to the East and the West, from Indonesia to the Caribbean and South America, with 21st-century music and the classics from across the whole world. All to bring the infinite world of music to as many ears, small and large, as possible.

During season 2025-2026 we will be performing two premiere productions. At the same time, our very own Oorkaan Ensemble has its debut in large theatres, with actors, in a co-production with De Toneelmakerij: 'Kantjil en de tijger'.

In the autumn of 2025, we will present a new production with the young, dynamic Aires Tropicales (flute, clarinet, oboe, horn and bassoon). Their music is a fusion of classical, Latin American, jazz and flamenco and the influence of their homeland Cuba can be heard and felt throughout.

From February 2026, the Oorkaan Ensemble and guest violinist Valentine Blangé will perform the reprise of 'Tempo', the successful 2024 staged concert, with music from composers such as Ravel, Vivaldi, Beethoven and Bartók, and a new composition by Martijn Padding.

There are also two other special international co-productions coming to the Netherlands. The first is 'Viva Banana', with the Tocuyito Trio, a co-production with our Viennese partner Jeunesse, directed by Caecilia Thunnissen and nominated for the international YAMaward 2024.

The second, youth opera 'Elektrische Fische', is a co-production with the Wiener Staatsoper and Jeunesse, directed by Kenza Koutchoukali and featuring new music by Hannah Eisendle.

Aires Tropicales, the Tocuyito Trio and Wieger Meulenbroek, assistant director of 'Viva Banana', are all alumni of the Jeunesse-Oorkaan-Academy, where every year four ensembles and four theatre makers are trained in the Oorkaan Method. In 2025, Muziekgebouw Productiehuis will join the academy as partner.

In addition, we offer workshops to go with all of our productions and create educational material for visiting schools, with the possibility to link workshops at schools. There's also the 'Make your own radio play' workshop for schools, open days and as fringe programming.

In short, a brilliant programme with a lot of choice and always with world-class musicians of international allure who perform staged concerts with music from all places and all eras. We look forward to coming to your venue and your audience!

The Aires Tropicales Quintet embodies a fusion of cultures and musical traditions within the framework of a traditional woodwind quintet. Originating from Cuba, their performances reflect a lively mix of influences. Unlike the typical repertoire of West European woodwind quintets, they embrace works of both great classical and Latin American composers, including flamenco music and Afro-Cuban polyphonic vocals.

The energy and unique background of these five Cuban musicians turn the West European woodwind quintet tradition upside down. Besides classical pieces by Mozart and Danzi, they play music by Paquito D'Rivera, Coqui Calzadilla and the

Buena Vista Social Club. Oboist Jorge Ruiz brings something extra to it with his virtuoso percussion, adding a much-appreciated dimension to their Afro Cuban repertoire.

This young quintet, founded in 2021 at Fontys Academy in Tilburg, always plays by heart and perfectly reflects Oorkaan's artistic profile. In 2024, they took part in the Jeunesse-Oorkaan-Academy. Their outdoor performance can be seen in Dutch concert halls and theatres from October 2025. Get ready for a musical journey, filled with passion, rhythm and cultural riches with the Aires Tropicales Quintet!





A musical performance for young people about a secret family history

De Toneelmakerij and Oorkaan take you on a journey to a world full of hidden memories. Poetical music theatre about a grandmother with a big secret, a brave girl that wants to know the truth and the dwarf deer Kantijl she unexpectedly befriends.

Indra's grandmother has been through a lot. She's old and sick now, and Indra, her mother and her sister look after her. Mom doesn't say much, while

the sister loves to talk! Family members come and go. They are nervous, sometimes making jokes and other times sombre. What does Indra's sister know that Indra doesn't? And what is happening with Grandma?

Indra hears Grandma talk in her sleep at night. About a country far from here, a country Indra doesn't know. While everyone else is in uproar, Indra goes off in search of Grandma's dream world. It's not long before she gets help from Kantijl, a dwarf deer that is so much smarter than the big animals that think they're the boss. Together, they put together the pieces of Grandma's past. But do they find all the pieces? Can Indra help her grandma? Are you ever too old to make sense of the past? And are you ever too young to find out your family history?

The mix of instruments and arrangements gives a mischievous edge to all these composers, from Beethoven to Brahms and from Bartók to Vivaldi. That's partly due to the playfulness of the performers. They follow each other across the stage, challenging each other, distracting each other only to then play together again. They almost remind you of children on a school playground. Sometimes they're islands, lost and searching, and other times they fit together like pieces of a puzzle, physically and musically, to form a whole – **Theaterkrant**

When you talk about music, you talk about time. And time is endless, certainly if you're seven. Or seven-and-a-half, almost eight, next week, the day after tomorrow, tomorrow, one more night's sleep. And time disappears when you're drawn into a world full of wonder. That's when time appears at its most infinite. Until, at once, it's over.

The members of the Oorkaan Ensemble speed through the musical dimension as experienced game avatars. They rush, leap, crash, run and stand still. But who actually sets the tempo? They are bombarded with rhythms! Let's hope that ends well... Having fun with notes, chords and each other, we travel through music that is full of unexpected twists and turns and surprising musical layers. We turn left, right, miss a turn, but we always get back to the same track.

As masters of their musical controllers, they are the ultimate masters of their instruments too, in 'Tempo', they play western classical pieces by Beethoven, Brahms and Vivaldi. As if that's not enough, they also reach new heights with contemporary classical music composed by Martijn Padding especially for them. Not being shackled by sheet music, chairs or anything else with legs, they make time both to race forward and to stand still for almost an hour. A staged concert to be drawn into like a black hole. Until you fall out of it, at the end, on your seat in the concert hall.

THE OORKAAN ENSEMBLE PLAYS

CONCERT PROGRAMME AND BOOKING

Completely new to our programme is the combination of a matinee of staged concert 'Tempo' and an evening concert by the Oorkaan Ensemble. These concerts, with a broad range of music in unique arrangements and with dynamic presentation, can also be booked separately.

SHIMMERING

The Oorkaan Ensemble presents the music from its debut album 'Shimmering' and enters into dialogue with the fascinating music of Türkiye and Indonesia. New compositions, centuries-old traditional music and the ensemble's own arrangements of well-known classics rub shoulders and are given a new look by constantly switching between all sorts of instruments. The music performed includes that of Fazil Say, Claude Debussy, Iwan Gunawan and Steven Kamperman. This programme can be booked for concerts lasting between 30 and 90 minutes. That could be, for example, a lunch concert with a focus on Turkish or Indonesian music or a full evening concert with music from both cultures.

'Elektrische Fische' tells the story of 13-year-old Emma, who had to move from Dublin to a small town in Mecklenburg-Vorpommern with her mother and two siblings. This abrupt change of location causes her great grief, she misses her grandparents, the English language, even the tea bags, which look different in Germany. Together with her new school friend Levin, she devises a plan on how to get back to her homeland. The sea, as both connecting and separating the two places, takes on a whole new meaning when Levin's mother suddenly needs help and Emma responds at just the right moment. 'Elektrische Fische' is about change, feeling homesick, family and friendship, and searches for answers to the question: "What does home mean to me?".

'Elektrische Fische' is a touring youth opera (10 +), based on Susan Kreller's novel, and is a co-production of the Wiener Staatsoper, Jeunesse and Oorkaan.

MAKE YOUR OWN RADIO PLAY

In addition to its staged concerts, Oorkaan is offering a special workshop: 'Make your own radio play'. In this workshop, children (or adults!) work on making a radio play, learning to use a variety of elements such as music, text and sound effects. The workshop is ideal for concert and theatre venues that would like to expand their programming with an interactive activity.

The workshop can be booked separately and is well-suited as a stand-alone programme element during festivals, open days or as fringe programming for existing concerts.

It can be carried out in almost any space, such as a studio or classroom. The Oorkaan workshop trainer brings a professional mobile recording studio with them. The radio plays made by the participants are published online after the workshop. That way, the creations can be shared with parents, family and friends!

EDUCATION AND FRINGE PROGRAMMING

EDUCATION MATERIALS

Oorkaan school concerts take the classroom to the concert hall. The classes prepare a visit to a concert, together with their own teacher, using an education kit adapted to the concert they will be attending. We offer three lesson packages:

- Package 1 consists of a digital education kit (that the teacher themselves can do in the class), the concert visit and a 'throwback box' for reflection on the concert.
- Package 2 is the same as Package 1, but with the addition of an Oorkaan workshop trainer n the class and a Meet & Greet with the musicians.
- Package 3 consists of Package 2 plus the 'Make your own radio play' workshop.

FRINGE PROGRAMMING

Oorkaan completes the concert experience with enhancing activities such as workshops and Meet & Greets with the musicians. That way, we give children the opportunity of discovering live music in an informal way, enhancing the experience of the staged concert. Together, we create an encounter they'll remember for a long time.

OORKAAN METHOD - HOW OUR PERFORMANCES ARE CREATED

Oorkaan makes performances based on the Oorkaan Method. The method focuses on the one hand on creating scenic material based on the music and with the musicians, and on the other hand, on the musician developing into a versatile performer. In addition to musicians, directors can also be trained according to the Oorkaan Method, helping them to discover all they need to be able to develop a staged concert. Caecilia and her artistic team offer master classes in this method, now internationally recognised. Master classes were given at such events as mdw – Universität für Musik und darstellende Kunst Wien, ArtEZ Zwolle, the Cello Biënnale Amsterdam and the Grachtenfestival.

The Jeunesse-Oorkaan-Academy was founded in 2021. Artistic director Caecilia Thunnissen and a team of Oorkaan trainers train musicians and theatre makers in creating and performing staged concerts for a young audience. The academy consists of master classes spread across six months, with an end presentation.
